



Advice for the historic environment

PROFILE: STEPHEN BOND MA HONDART FSA MRICS GRADDIPCONSAA



Stephen Bond runs heritage consultancy, *Heritage Places*, from Taunton providing advice for the historic environment to national and local government, public sector funding bodies, and property management, development and institutional clients. In the 1990s, he undertook a seven year secondment to the Board of Historic Royal Palaces, at that time a UK Government agency as its Surveyor of the Fabric. He has been a course director of the College of Estate Management's Masters Programme in Conservation of the Historic Environment (now run by University of Reading) since 1990. De Montfort University awarded him an honorary doctorate in 1998 in recognition of his contribution to building surveying and conservation. He lectures widely on a range of heritage matters including condition surveying of major assets. He joint-authored 'Managing Built Heritage – the role of cultural significance', published by Wiley-Blackwell in 2008 and a second edition is due to be published early in 2016.
